for kids participating in creating homes



Thank you for your passion for <u>A Sense of Home</u> and for sharing that passion with the kids in your life.

From One Kid to Another

We'd love your participation in "From One Kid to Another". This is a great place to start your kids' involvement in ASOH.





We suggest that your kids look around their bedroom and wardrobe, looking for items that are no longer needed but would be of great value to a child whose family has most likely experienced homelessness.



Please have your kids bundle up and separate their once loved items (that they no longer need) into age categories. These categories will indicate what age your child was when they wore the clothes or played with the toys.



Please review the items in each bundle, think about their condition and how much dignity they may afford. Please ensure the soles of shoes have been cleaned, no holes or stains on clothing, no writing in books, etc.



Here is the most important and fun step – package these once loved items into age appropriate "welcome home baskets/boxes" for a deserving young child. For example, for your daughter who has outgrown her five-year-old items, she should bundle up all items that are ideal for a girl aged five. This might include shoes, clothes, books, puzzles, school supplies, DVDs, toys, etc.



One basket should include at the very least two full clothing outfits (a minimum of two tops and two bottoms), two pairs of shoes, two books and two toys.

Items should then be placed into their own tote, basket or toy box (a container that has value and can be used – even if it is simply a clear plastic box with a lid). It is important that the container you place donation items in is worthy of being placed directly into someone's first ever home (rather than a cardboard box).



Your child should write a loving note indicating why they are so excited to share these items and including well wishes to the recipient.

Then repeat this activity for the same age group and gender.

Once you have run out of sufficient items for the first chosen age range, move onto different age ranges.



The goal is for your donation to be ready to go straight into a home, just like a gift box.

If your kids enjoy doing this, they could **inspire their peers to do the same**. They may share their story and how-to information with all their friends and classmates, suggesting everyone does the same. Kids might choose to share their experience in the form of a presentation to their class, creating a video, writing an essay — or simply sharing their passion.



Donation Delivery

Donation delivery needs to be scheduled and items must be dropped off during the pandemic. Deliveries are accepted on Tuesdays only, at our Operations Center & Warehouse at **3457 W El Segundo Blvd, unit A, Hawthorne, CA 90250**. To Volunteer in Our Operations Center & Warehouse

To volunteer in our Operations Center & Warehouse you can schedule a day and time by emailing <u>volunteer@asenseofhome.org</u>.

A volunteer typically sorts through donations and creates kits that will be placed into homes. For example, cooking kits, eating kits, bathroom kits, and decor kits. Each and every home gets the same items. A child must be 7+ to volunteer with their parent. For a child to volunteer on their own they must be 15+.
